Rebecca S. Farber, MD, is an Assistant Professor of Neurology at Columbia University Medical Center, where she treats patients with multiple sclerosis (MS) and other autoimmune central nervous system conditions at the Columbia University Multiple Sclerosis Clinical Care and Research Center, an institution dedicated to providing advanced diagnostic and therapeutic MS care. In addition to direct patient care, Dr. Farber conducts research in advanced neuroimaging of MS, cognitive function in MS, as well as the autoimmune condition neuromyelitis optica.

After earning her BA in psychology from Yale University, Dr. Farber completed medical school and a neurology residency at the Mount Sinai Medical Center. She then completed a three year fellowship in MS at the Corinne Goldsmith Dickinson Center for MS at Mount Sinai, during which time she was a recipient of the Sylvia Lawry Physician Fellowship from the National MS Society. Dr. Farber is board certified in neurology by the American Academy of Psychiatry and Neurology.

Dr. Farber is a contributor to the MS peer-reviewed literature and has presented at international meetings.
