

## Rebecca S. Farber, MD



Rebecca S. Farber, MD, is an Assistant Professor of Neurology at Columbia University Medical Center, where she treats patients with MS and other autoimmune central nervous system conditions at the Columbia University Multiple Sclerosis Clinical Care and Research Center,

an institution dedicated to providing the most advanced diagnostic and therapeutic care available. In addition to direct patient care, Dr. Farber conducts research in advanced neuroimaging of MS, cognitive function in MS, as well as the autoimmune condition neuromyelitis optica.

After earning a BA in psychology from Yale University, Dr. Farber completed medical school and a neurology residency at the Mount Sinai Medical Center. She then completed a 3 year fellowship in Multiple Sclerosis at the Corinne Goldsmith Dickinson Center for MS at Mount Sinai, during which time she was a recipient of the Sylvia Lawry Physician Fellowship from the National MS Society. Dr. Farber is board certified in neurology by the American Academy of Psychiatry and Neurology.

A contributor to the MS peer-review literature, Dr. Farber also has presented at international meetings on the areas of her clinical research.
